Topics covered include:

- An introduction to the legal relationships in a construction project and the main sources of construction law.
- The construction project environment, and its influence on construction law principles.
- Standard form construction contracts: the recognised standard forms in South Africa, risk distribution and construction contract mechanisms and processes common to all standard forms.
- The role and liability of project managers, surveyors, designers, contract administrators, architects and engineers on construction projects.
- Construction claims, notification and time-barring.
- Construction disputes and alternative dispute resolution processes.
